Devashish Krishan, an Indian national, has worked in international arbitration and public international law in London, The Hague, Mumbai, New Delhi and Washington, DC. He practiced with a U.S. firm in London and served as assistant legal counsel at the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague. He has been counsel in major arbitrations including *Renta 4 et. al v. The Russian Federation* and *Helnan International Hotels v. The Arab Republic of Egypt* and has been appointed as an arbitrator by the London Court of International Arbitration (LCIA). Widely published, he regularly participates in professional associations and groupings as a speaker and office-bearer. He has been recognized for excellence by the Global Arbitration Review: GAR Top 30 and Who's Who Legal: Commercial Arbitration.
