Ms. Kirby is an internationally recognized arbitration expert, who acts as counsel and sits as arbitrator in a wide variety of arbitration matters, including experience under most major institutional and ad hoc arbitral rules. Ms. Kirby began her career with a multinational firm as a New York litigator, representing clients in both international arbitrations and complex commercial litigations, with a particular focus on securities, insurance, mergers and acquisitions and white collar criminal cases. From there, she went to the ICC International Court of Arbitration, where she serves as both Counsel and Deputy Secretary General before leaving to join a multinational law firm as a partner in their arbitration group in France.
