Pinochet's Legacy Reassessed

Professor Ingrid B. Wuerth



Ingrid Wuerth is a leading scholar of foreign affairs and international law in domestic courts. Her articles on the German Constitution and comparative constitutional law have been published in the Chicago, Michigan, Northwestern and Notre Dame law reviews, the Harvard and Virginia journals of international law, and the American Journal of International Law. She was a Morehead Scholar at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and graduated from the University of Chicago Law School. After law school, she clerked for federal judges and practiced at Dechert in Philadelphia. Professor Wuerth joined Vanderbilt's law faculty in 2007. She was appointed director of Vanderbilt's International Legal Studies Program in fall 2009 and has won several teaching awards. Professor Wuerth has served as the co-chair of the American Society of International Law's Interest Group on International Law in the Domestic Courts. She is also a member of the State Department's Advisory Committee on Public International Law.
