Professor Kele Stewart

Kele Stewart is a Professor of Clinical Legal Education and Co-Director of the Miami Law Children & Youth Law Clinic. In the Clinic, she supervises students who handle cases involving abused, abandoned and neglected children. Professor Stewart earned a B.S. in 1994 from Cornell University and a J.D. in 1998 from N.Y.U. Law. Prior to joining Miami Law, she was an attorney at the Brennan Center for Justice at N.Y.U. Law. She focused on voting rights litigation and advocacy as well as supervised law students in NYU's public policy clinic. She spent five years in private practice doing an array of pro bono work at Simpson Thacher & Bartlett and White & Case. Prior to law school, she worked as a case worker for teenagers in foster care. She serves on the Advisory Board of Florida's Children First, the Executive Board of the Clinical Legal Education Association (CLEA) and the Independent Living Services Advisory Council.
