What Does it Mean to be an International Lawyer?

Lucy Reed is the co-head of the Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer global international arbitration group. Reed chairs the Institute for Transnational Arbitration (ITA) and served as President of the American Society of International Law (2008- 2010). She was an arbitrator on the Eritrea-Ethiopia Claims Commission, and served as a co-director of the Claims Resolution Tribunal for Dormant Accounts in Switzerland (the Holocaust tribunal). She was the first general counsel of the Korean Peninsula Energy Development Organization, was in the State Department Legal Adviser's Office, and served as the US agent to the Iran-US Claims Tribunal.

Erica Stein is an associate at Hanotiau & van den Berg in Belgium where she specializes in international arbitration. She has acted as arbitrator, counsel and secretary to arbitral tribunals in numerous proceedings (e.g., ICC, SCC, UNCITRAL, ICSID, SIAC). Prior to joining Hanotiau & van den Berg, she worked as Counsel at the ICC International Court of Arbitration in Paris, overseeing hundreds of cases pending under the ICC Rules, spanning numerous industry sectors and regions. She was recently selected among the International Who's Who of Commercial Arbitration 2012.
