PROFESSOR PABLO T. SPILLER

Pablo Spiller is the Jeffrey A. Jacobs Distinguished Professor of Business & Technology at the University of California, Berkeley and Visiting Professor of Law at Columbia University. Spiller has consulted for the World Bank, the InterAmerican Bank, the UNDP and multiple governments. He is unrivalled among international quantum experts, having testified before some 80 international tribunals in disputes affecting a wide variety of industries, many of them involving stakes of billions of dollars.

PROFESSOR JAN PAULSSON

World-renowned international arbitration expert Jan Paulsson holds the Michael Klein Distinguished Scholar Chair at Miami Law. He has served worldwide in over 500 arbitrations. He has also acted before a great variety international tribunals including the International Court of Justice. He is the President of the International Council for Commercial Arbitration of the International Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague, and a board member of the American Arbitration Association.
